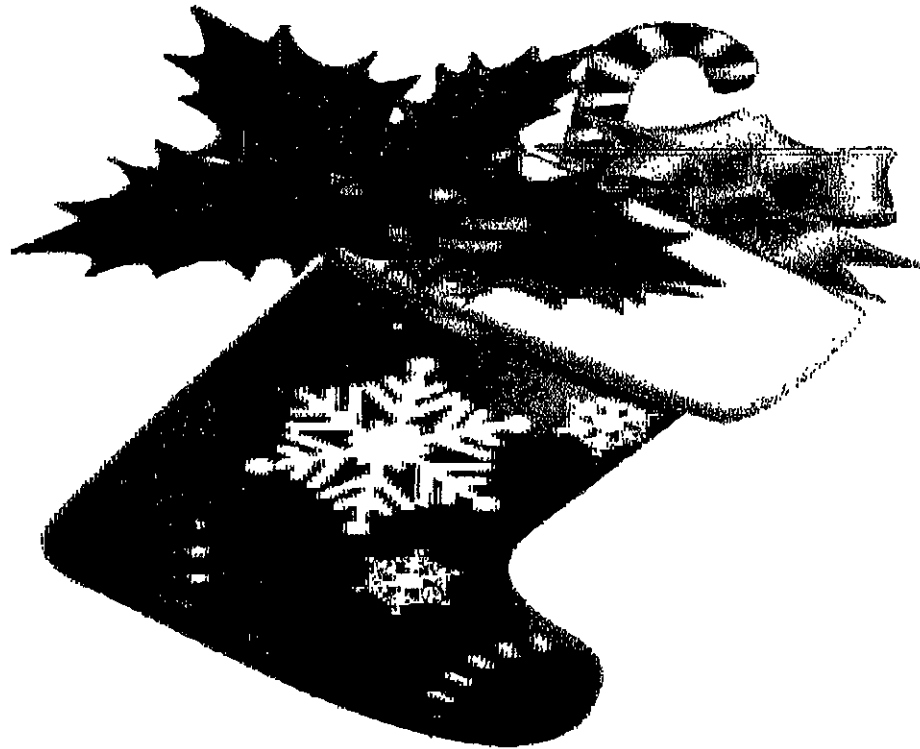

Sacred Wolf Friendship Centre is currently seeking to fill the position of Child/Family Development Worker. This position is a permanent full time (35hrs/week) position available immediately. The Family & Early Childhood Development Worker (FECDW) provides direct support and education services to individuals and families with children ages 0-6 (or those who may become parents) to improve the health of children, enhance child development and increase practical skills around child rearing. These services range from intensive in-home supports, to group activities and workshops. The FECDW is directly responsible to the Executive Director/Social Worker. Anticipated Start Date December 1, 2011.

Direct Client Work

- Maintain a caseload of clients
- Provide direct, intensive supports to individuals/families/groups
 - Child Development, Positive behavioural strategies, Reading, Safety/Injury Prevention, Stress Management, Parenting, Pre- and post-natal health, Life styles, address special needs and early intervention
- Provide education and work on intensive concrete skill development with individuals and families
 - Child development, Nutrition, FAS/E
 - Household Management, Home safety/injury prevention
 - Dental hygiene, Pre-school literacy (and other school readiness), Promotion of breast feeding, Stress management, Build self-esteem in children and families
- Utilize culturally relevant tools/methodologies
- Work with other staff in facilitation of prevention programs, group activities, workshops, etc.

The Kwakiutl First Nation is seeking candidates interested in the position of a Child & Youth Worker Assistant for the community of Fort Rupert. The successful applicant will be responsible for the following:

- ◆ Plan and implement variety of age appropriate athletic, recreational, and cultural programs for children & pre-teens aged 8 to 12 years of age.
- ◆ Monitor and evaluate program implementation
- ◆ Promote recreational and sports activities in Fort Rupert for children and Youth
- ◆ Assist in the preparation of funding proposals
- ◆ Supervise out of community field trips as required
- ◆ Undertake fund raising initiatives in support of children & youth activities and programs
- ◆ Provide one-on-one guidance and counseling for children and youth or make appropriate referrals
